PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The school will provide an educational environment, which will allow students in the School of Excellence a chance to undertake curriculum studies and training programs concurrently. There will be a direct link in years 7, 8, 9, and 10 which can lead to students electing to pursue AFL at a senior level in years 11 & 12. It is our intention that at the completion of their schooling, students will be well placed to compete for places in tertiary institutions or employment.

The AFL Excellence program exceeds the requirements of national curriculum for the Health and Physical Education Key Learning Area. The program consists of practical and theory elements relating to sport and health.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- Learning how to train to maximise performance


- Active development of leadership skills

SELECTION CRITERIA

The AFL program will be offered to students in their final year of primary school and if accepted students will start year 7 the following year at Park Ridge SHS. Other students may be invited to apply in later years where they have demonstrated a commitment to the goals and culture of the program. Entry into year 7 AFL is not dependant on advanced skills in AFL. Students will be selected on the following criteria:

- 1. Commitment to sporting pursuits and willingness to work within a team environment.
- 2. School attendance is at 90% or above
- 3. Exemplary record of school conduct and behaviour
- 4. Positive report from designated teacher.

Students who are successful will be offered enrolment and a place in AFL for 2022. Students who fail to meet criteria 2 or 3 may be granted provisional status into the program at the discretion of the school, allowing them time to demonstrate commitment to studies and appropriate conduct and behaviour.



COMMUNITY

The program will foster closer relationships with the wider community including sporting associations, tertiary institutions, AFL Queensland, Brisbane Lions Academy, Gold Coast Suns Academy, Brisbane South Region, Metropolitan West and Queensland Academy of Sport.

Academy students will also be provided with access to performance enhancement agencies (exercise and sports psychologists) and associated support agencies (sports medicine, physiotherapists).

SCHOOL RESPONSIBILITIES

- Expect high standards of behaviour, dress and attendance



- Ensure quality coaches and external support networks
- Facilitate the improvement of skills, participation and enjoyment





Dear Parents/Guardians,

The Curriculum Activity Risk Assessment (CARA) guidelines have recently been revised for contact sports such as Australian football, rugby league and European Handball. Students are now required to wear mouth guards when participating in all contact sports.

There are a variety of mouth guards available to purchase, however the education department strongly recommends that students wear custom-fitted mouth guards. Wearing a custom-fitted mouth guard helps to absorb and spread the impact of a blow to the face, which may otherwise result in an injury to the mouth or jaw. Mouth guards can protect students from some serious sporting injuries, such as broken jaws, fractured, cracked or knocked-out teeth, cut lips and tongues (ADA, 2019).

<u>Custom fitted mouth guards</u> are superior to over the counter mouth guards and are made from a dental impression and a plaster model of the teeth. They provide the best protection fit and comfort for all levels of sport. <u>Over-the-counter (boil and bite)</u> mouth guards include stock mouth guards that do not require fitting, and mouth guards that can be placed in hot water and then self-fitted by biting into them. These offer less protection, can dislodge during play and are not recommended (ADA, 2019).
